- 7.1 Steve mentioned the fire at Sheet and suggested a formal 'thank you' be extended to the two men who summoned the emergency services. It was noted that the hedges in Mill Lane do not allow easy passage of a fire engine and it was pointed out that the access is restricted all the way along the lane due to this and cars parked by the houses. It was suggested that this issue be raised with Sheet PC. (Vanessa)
- 7.2 Julie Yardley Julie explained her concerns about plot holders spraying on the allotments and that sometimes individuals are not even sure what they are spraying. Plot holders are not properly trained nor do they wear protective clothing. Spray drifts across to others' plots and affects the crops, wildlife and any person or animal it gets into contact with. Julie feels that plot holders should inform the council and other plot holders what, when and where they are spraying. There was a really useful discussion about the issue and much support and interest from the committee.

It was agreed that Julie should prepare a questionnaire to find out what is happening at present and to determine plot holders' opinions on spraying and how it should be managed. This would be considered by the committee then shown to SPC and PTC. Julie is happy for anyone to visit her plot to see her compost heap and how she gardens organically.

The meeting closed at 8:15 pm
